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Starting your Academic Journey

When starting out on an academic career track, you might focus more on developing your teaching excellence.

At this stage, colleagues typically look for opportunities to develop teaching practice and explore the evidence base for effective practice. Your path to promotion will involve collecting evidence of that effectiveness through qualifications, recognition, or awards, or sharing practice and developing collaborations. As you progress along your academic journey, you will also need to develop and evidence effective scholarship or leadership in the sphere of education. Evidencing the impact of your excellent practice becomes even more important. At this stage you might want to explore opportunities for developing your own pedagogic scholarship practice. You are also encouraged to reflect on and develop your skills in leadership and seek out opportunities to put those skills into practice, either internally or externally to demonstrate your impact on colleagues or strategies.

Throughout your career, opportunities for mentoring are a way to reflect on your own skills and development while also supporting colleagues in their development. It is an opportunity to impact on the practice of others through sharing your expertise and leadership, another important aspect of evidencing your impact.

Here, we map current support available to allow you to tailor your own development along these themes of impact in terms of teaching excellence, scholarship, leadership, and mentoring. We encourage you to use this document to explore your own development needs based on your current strengths and the direction you wish to go.





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
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Teaching Excellence

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
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Postgraduate Certificate in Academic Practice

The Postgraduate Certificate Academic Practice (PGCAP) is a Level 7 qualification, accredited by Advance HE for Fellowship, which can be taken as an exit award, or part of the University's PGDip/MA in Academic Practice to the Academy's Postgraduate Diploma Academic Practice (PGDAP) and Master of Arts Academic Practice (MA AP).

The overall aim of the PGCAP is to support and enhance the development of a rich and diverse learning and teaching culture at the University of Liverpool.

The programme is accredited by Advance HE and enables colleagues with substantive and significant teaching responsibilities to gain a teaching qualification and recognition as a Fellow of the Higher Education Academy (FHEA).





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
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Postgraduate Diploma and MA in Academic Practice

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



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
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Academic Advisor Network




The Liverpool Learning Summit




These sessions are designed to recognise the collaborative nature of effective leadership and respond to the experiences of leaders and managers from across academic, research, professional and technical roles.

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
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Diversity and Equality Training

The University of Liverpool is dedicated to recognising academic and professional service colleagues who support excellence in learning and teaching. Since 2016, this recognition has included the award of Learning and Teaching Fellowships, granted to individual staff who can evidence an outstanding contribution to the innovation and development of educational practice. The Fellowship scheme is hosted by The Academy. Those recognised and celebrated by the award of Fellow continue to play a key role in the on-going development, sharing and adoption of innovative practice, supporting the University's strategic ambition for educational excellence.


Learning and Teaching and Student Experience Awards

Since the mid-1990s, the University has been recognising the importance of excellence in learning and teaching in providing a highquality experience for its students through the annual Learning & Teaching and Student Experience Awards scheme. The award scheme is open to all staff (academic and professional services) at Faulty level, from early career staff to experienced staff. Nominations should relate to the activity of an individual or group of staff. Nominations should be made to recognise, value and reward staff for a demonstrable positive impact on learning and teaching / student experience activities. Each successful LTSE awardee is invited to submit an application for the Faculty Sir Alistair Pilkington Award.

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
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University of Liverpool Teaching Recognition and Accreditation Framework (ULTRA)

ULTRA provides opportunities to all those who teach or support learning, or who are educational leaders, at the University to reflect on and evidence their practice and apply for professional recognition. It is accredited by Advance HE and aligned to the Professional Standards Framework (PSF 2023). Successful applicants gain Fellowship.

After gaining Fellowship you can also act as a mentor or reviewer on ULTRA, supporting the operation of the programme. ULTRA is suitable for staff who have substantial recent experience, usually of three or more years' full time equivalent (FTE), of teaching and supporting learning or educational leadership in higher education. Applicants can apply for one of four categories of Fellowship:

- Descriptor 1 Associate Fellow
- Descriptor 2 Fellow
- Descriptor 3 Senior Fellow
- Descriptor 4 Principal Fellow





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
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Peer Observation of Teaching

Peer Observation of Teaching is part of the University of Liverpool's quality enhancement process providing both the Observee and Observer with the opportunity to explore teaching practice and reflect on teaching methods in a collegial environment. Where appropriate, the opportunity to disseminate effective practice will be part of this process. The Academic Development team offer regular workshops for colleagues who wish to become peer observers.





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
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PGR Supervisor Network

On the PGR Supervisors Network Canvas site you will find a wide range of training and support for developing your practice as a PGR supervisor. These resources are designed to make you reflect on your current practice as a supervisor, to help you make deliberate choices in how you approach your supervisory practice, and to underpin your practice with scholarly evidence. The PGR Supervisors Network is aimed at supervisors on all Postgraduate Research Degrees, including PhD, MPhil, MD and Professional Doctorates.
