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Foundations of Learning and Teaching in HE

The Foundations of Learning and Teaching in HE (FLTHE) supports those new to university teaching to develop their teaching practice and confidence in the classroom. The programme consists of two stages. Stage 1 is open to anyone in the university with an interest in teaching or supporting student learning, providing participants with an introduction to learning theories, classroom management, inclusive teaching, and assessment and feedback. Stage 2 is accredited by Advance HE for Associate Fellowship, enabling successful participants to gain this valuable recognition of their teaching knowledge and skills.



Introduction to Supporting Student Learning (Stage 1)


Introduction to Supporting Student Learning, also known as Stage 1 of Foundations of Learning and Teaching in Higher Education, has been designed to address some of the foundational knowledge and essential skills needed for effective teaching in higher education settings.

Foundations of Learning and Teaching (Stage 2)

The FLTHE programme has been designed to support staff new to teaching and those with closely defined teaching responsibilities, such as visiting lecturers, professional services, clinician–educators, demonstrators, and postgraduate research students who teach, to gain Associate Fellowship. This part of the programme builds on Stage 1 through reflective experiential learning to support further development of inclusive and effective educational practice.

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
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Peer Observation of Teaching

The Academic Development team offer regular workshops for colleagues who wish to become peer observers.





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
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PGR Supervisor Network

These resources are designed to make you reflect on your current practice as a supervisor, to help you make deliberate choices in how you approach your supervisory practice, and to underpin your practice with scholarly evidence. The PGR Supervisors Network is aimed at supervisors on all Postgraduate Research Degrees, including PhD, MPhil, MD and Professional Doctorates.

Treasure Island Pedagogies Podcast




The National Teaching Repository is an open access online searchable database where tried and tested strategies 'that work' can be housed and harvested.


The Liverpool Learning Summit

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
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Faculty of Academic and Clinical Educators (FACE)

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
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School of Medicine Learning Lunches

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
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Integrated Clinical Academic Training

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

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
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University of Liverpool Teaching Recognition and Accreditation Framework (ULTRA)

ULTRA provides opportunities to all those who teach or support learning, or who are educational leaders, at the University to reflect on and evidence their practice and apply for professional recognition. It is accredited by Advance HE and aligned to the Professional Standards Framework (PSF 2023). Successful applicants gain Fellowship.

After gaining Fellowship you can also act as a mentor or reviewer on ULTRA, supporting the operation of the programme. ULTRA is suitable for staff who have substantial recent experience, usually of three or more years' full time equivalent (FTE), of teaching and supporting learning or educational leadership in higher education. Applicants can apply for one of four categories of Fellowship:

- Descriptor 1 Associate Fellow
- Descriptor 2 Fellow
- Descriptor 3 Senior Fellow
- Descriptor 4 Principal Fellow





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
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Becoming a Mentor

Mentoring is an opportunity to support the development of your colleagues and, in doing so, helps develop a range of communication and interpersonal skills and enhances your self-awareness and reflective practice. You can be a mentor on PGCAP or ULTRA, working with colleagues on their applications, or more generally through the University of Liverpool Mentoring Network.





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The Passport provides an e-portfolio space for you to reflect on your academic practice, leadership, and scholarship, and collect evidence of your success, enabling you to gain recognition and develop your career. The Passport promotes reflective practice, and engagement with CPD to enhance your teaching, support for learning, and career development.
