The Academic Development Team supports those who teach and/or support learning to develop their academic practice, leadership, and scholarship through a range of accredited, peer, e-learning, and other opportunities.

The University's Values and Strategy 2031 and the Professional Standards Framework (2023) are embedded throughout our programmes. We are committed to high-quality education and believe that those who teach and/or support learning are central to achieving the University's purpose of transforming students' lives and creating a fairer, better world.

To enable you to thrive our Connected CPD strategy shows how you can develop your teaching and support for students' learning in your role and gain recognition to enhance your career development.

Colleagues in Professional Services roles contribute to teaching and learning at the University of Liverpool in many ways. You might be working in Careers, Library, or Student Services, interacting directly with students. Learning and Educational Developers might also be supporting module or programmes teams to implement aspects of the curriculum or you could be supporting students with disabilities to access learning. The following CPD pathways indicate valuable activities to support your learning and teaching progression at different career stages, including through taught programmes and selfdirected learning, as well as networking and leadership opportunities.





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For colleagues involved in directly supporting student learning, the FLTHE programme allows you to build teaching skills and gain formal teaching recognition as Associate Fellow.

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Foundations of Learning and Teaching in HE

The Foundations of Learning and Teaching in HE (FLTHE) supports those new to university teaching to develop their teaching practice and confidence in the classroom. The programme consists of two stages. Stage 1 is open to anyone in the university with an interest in teaching or supporting student learning, providing participants with an introduction to learning theories, classroom management, inclusive teaching, and assessment and feedback. Stage 2 is accredited by Advance HE for Associate Fellowship, enabling successful participants to gain this valuable recognition of their teaching knowledge and skills.



Introduction to Supporting Student Learning (Stage 1)


Introduction to Supporting Student Learning, also known as Stage 1 of Foundations of Learning and Teaching in Higher Education, has been designed to address some of the foundational knowledge and essential skills needed for effective teaching in higher education settings.

Foundations of Learning and Teaching (Stage 2)

The FLTHE programme has been designed to support staff new to teaching and those with closely defined teaching responsibilities, such as visiting lecturers, professional services, clinician–educators, demonstrators, and postgraduate research students who teach, to gain Associate Fellowship. This part of the programme builds on Stage 1 through reflective experiential learning to support further development of inclusive and effective educational practice.

PGCAP

The Postgraduate Certificate Academic Practice (PGCAP) is a Level 7 qualification, accredited by Advance HE for Fellowship, which can be taken as an exit award, or part of the Academy's Postgraduate Diploma Academic Practice (PGDAP) and Master of Arts Academic Practice (MA AP).

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
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Postgraduate Certificate in Academic Practice

The Postgraduate Certificate Academic Practice (PGCAP) is a Level 7 qualification, accredited by Advance HE for Fellowship, which can be taken as an exit award, or part of the University's PGDip/MA in Academic Practice.

The overall aim of the PGCAP is to support and enhance the development of a rich and diverse learning and teaching culture at the University of Liverpool.

The programme is accredited by Advance HE and enables colleagues with substantive and significant teaching responsibilities to gain a teaching qualification and recognition as a Fellow of the Higher Education Academy (FHEA).





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
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Postgraduate Diploma and MA in Academic Practice

The PGDAP builds on prior learning from the PGCAP and leads on to the MA AP. This is a fee-free internal development programme for University of Liverpool staff. The overall aim of the PGDip/MA Academic Practice is to develop academic practice, leadership, and scholarship to enhance learning and teaching in higher education.





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

Treasure Island Pedagogies Podcast




The National Teaching Repository is an open access online searchable database where tried and tested strategies 'that work' can be housed and harvested.



Leadership Development Opportunities



These sessions are designed to recognise the collaborative nature of effective leadership and respond to the experiences of leaders and managers from across academic, research, professional and technical roles.





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
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Diversity and Equality Training

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
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Becoming a Mentor

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
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Professional recognition through ULTRA

ULTRA (The University of Liverpool Teaching Recognition and Accreditation Framework) provides a self-guided route to professional recognition as either Senior Fellow or Principal Fellow of Advance HE. It is for experienced colleagues who influence the practice of others, either through mentoring or support of colleagues, or influence policy and strategy at UoL in relation to teaching and student learning.





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Evidencing your contribution to educational practice

Applying for a Fellowship or Teaching Award is a way of gaining recognition for your excellent teaching practice and also showcasing your innovative work and sharing your practice with others. By gaining such recognition, you also evidence your impact and leadership within learning and teaching.

Learning and Teaching Fellowship Scheme

The University of Liverpool is dedicated to recognising academic and professional service colleagues who support excellence in learning and teaching. Since 2016, this recognition has included the award of Learning and Teaching Fellowships, granted to individual staff who can evidence an outstanding contribution to the innovation and development of educational practice. The Fellowship scheme is hosted by The Academy. Those recognised and celebrated by the award of Fellow continue to play a key role in the on-going development, sharing and adoption of innovative practice, supporting the University's strategic ambition for educational excellence.


Learning and Teaching and Student Experience Awards

Since the mid-1990s, the University has been recognising the importance of excellence in learning and teaching in providing a highquality experience for its students through the annual Learning & Teaching and Student Experience Awards scheme. The award scheme is open to all staff (academic and professional services) at Faulty level, from early career staff to experienced staff. Nominations should relate to the activity of an individual or group of staff. Nominations should be made to recognise, value and reward staff for a demonstrable positive impact on learning and teaching / student experience activities. Each successful LTSE awardee is invited to submit an application for the Faculty Sir Alistair Pilkington Award.

The National Teaching Fellowship (NTF) and Collaborative Award for Teaching Excellence (CATE), coordinated by Advance HE, recognise and reward excellence in teaching in Higher Education in England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. Colleagues interested in these awards can apply to join the UoL NTF/CATE pipeline programme.





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The Passport provides an e-portfolio space for you to reflect on your academic practice, leadership, and scholarship, and collect evidence of your success, enabling you to gain recognition and develop your career. The Passport promotes reflective practice, and engagement with CPD to enhance your teaching, support for learning, and career development.
