Further Notes for Applicants to Medicine Programmes

Admission Tests:

All non-graduate applicants applying to the A100 programme will be required to sit UCAT. Please see www.ucat.ac.uk

All graduates applying to either the A101 or A100 programme will be required to sit GAMSAT. Details at <http://gamsat.acer.edu.au/gamsat-uk>

Details of how we use the tests are outlined in our A100 and A101 Departmental Supplements to the Admissions Policy:

- **Accepted applicants to the A100 medicine programme must be 18 years old by the 1st October in the year of entry to the programme**
- All applicants to the University of Liverpool School of Medicine who hold a degree at the time of application are usually expected to have graduated with at least a 2:1 or hold a 2.2 plus a Masters/PhD higher qualification regardless of the programme they apply to.
- Applicants with A levels in Biology and Chemistry will not usually be considered under the guidelines for applicants with non-traditional qualifications.
- Applicants can apply to our programmes with both pending or achieved degrees.
- If an applicant fails to achieve a place on the A100 programme they may only make one further consecutive application to the programme.
- We review all applications on an individual basis, but we do not usually consider transfers into the medicine programme.
- Applicants currently studying for a master's degree must have completed their programme prior to registration on the appropriate medicine programme. Applicants currently undertaking a PhD must have submitted their thesis by January 1st of the year that they wish to enter the University of Liverpool-School of Medicine. Applicants should familiarise themselves with the start dates of their programme of interest and if invited to interview applicants will be expected to provide appropriate proof in relation to the expected completion date of their programme or submission of their thesis.
- Chemistry, Biology (or Core & Additional Science or Dual/Triple Science), English Language and Mathematics are considered core subjects.
- Applicants should make sure that their UCAS form is completed as fully as possible with details given of subjects studied and grades obtained throughout their secondary education. Full details of study/qualifications in our core subjects should be given. Failure to do so will potentially lead to the rejection of the application on the basis of insufficient information.
- The personal statement and academic reference, although required, are not routinely screened as part of the decision to invite individuals to interview. Please note that certain groups of applicants are required to complete an **applicant on-line form** which can be accessed at [Admissions information - School of Medicine - University of Liverpool](#) from September 2024. Please use the on-line form to inform us of any extenuating circumstances, and ensure your academic referee reflects on these in their reference.
- All potential applicants should familiarise themselves with the information and guidance held on this website.

Please note:

- Applicants **must** read the appropriate programme Departmental Supplement to the Admissions Policy. Applications made through UCAS in the normal way. An **additional on-line form** may need to be completed by certain groups of applicants. Please refer to [Admissions information - School of Medicine - University of Liverpool](#) for details.
- The selection procedure at Liverpool is a competitive process. The indicative criteria are the **minimum** required. Invitation to interview is highly competitive and dependant on academic achievement and admission test performance. Meeting the minimum academic criteria does not guarantee that you will be invited to interview. Non-academic attributes will be assessed at interview and offers will be made to the most competitive applicants. No candidate will be made an offer without interview. The threshold for progressing through each stage of the process varies annually depending upon the quality and quantity of applications.
