As you explore campus, you will pass our modern, sustainable and well-equipped residences, which include Crown Place (building ref 526-528 overhead), Vine Court (804 and 805), Dover Court (806) and our most recent completed hall, Philharmonic Court (855). There is a range of self-catering ensuite accommodation on campus. Our Student Villages, situated around 3 miles from the campus, offer a fantastic student community experience in the leafy suburbs of south Liverpool. Please note, it is not possible to visit any of our residences outside official Open Days.

Abercromby Square | D
 Built between 1820 and 1865, and named after General Sir Ralph Abercromby, commander in chief of the British Army in Egypt, who was killed in the battle of Alexandria in 1801, the square was originally occupied by Liverpool's shipping merchants. The University acquired the square in the 1920's and it is now home to the Institute of Irish Studies, Philosophy, Civic Design, History and Archaeology, Classics and Egyptology.



Victoria Gallery & Museum 421 | L
 The Victoria Building, the first purpose built building of the University, originally opened in 1889. Designed by the Liverpool-born architect Alfred Waterhouse (who also designed the Natural History Museum in London) its distinctive redbrick design is the source of the term 'redbrick university'. The building now houses a museum, containing works by JMW Turner, Lucien Freud and John James Audobon.



Vine Court 804, 805 | E
 Vine Court offers self-catering accommodation for around 750 students. Study bedrooms are all ensuite with a high speed broadband connection with shared social kitchen/diners and lounge areas. Vine Court has an excellent restaurant, laundrette and large student chill-out mezzanine and outdoor spaces for socialising.

 Our Career Studio is the UK's first peer-to-peer employability space. 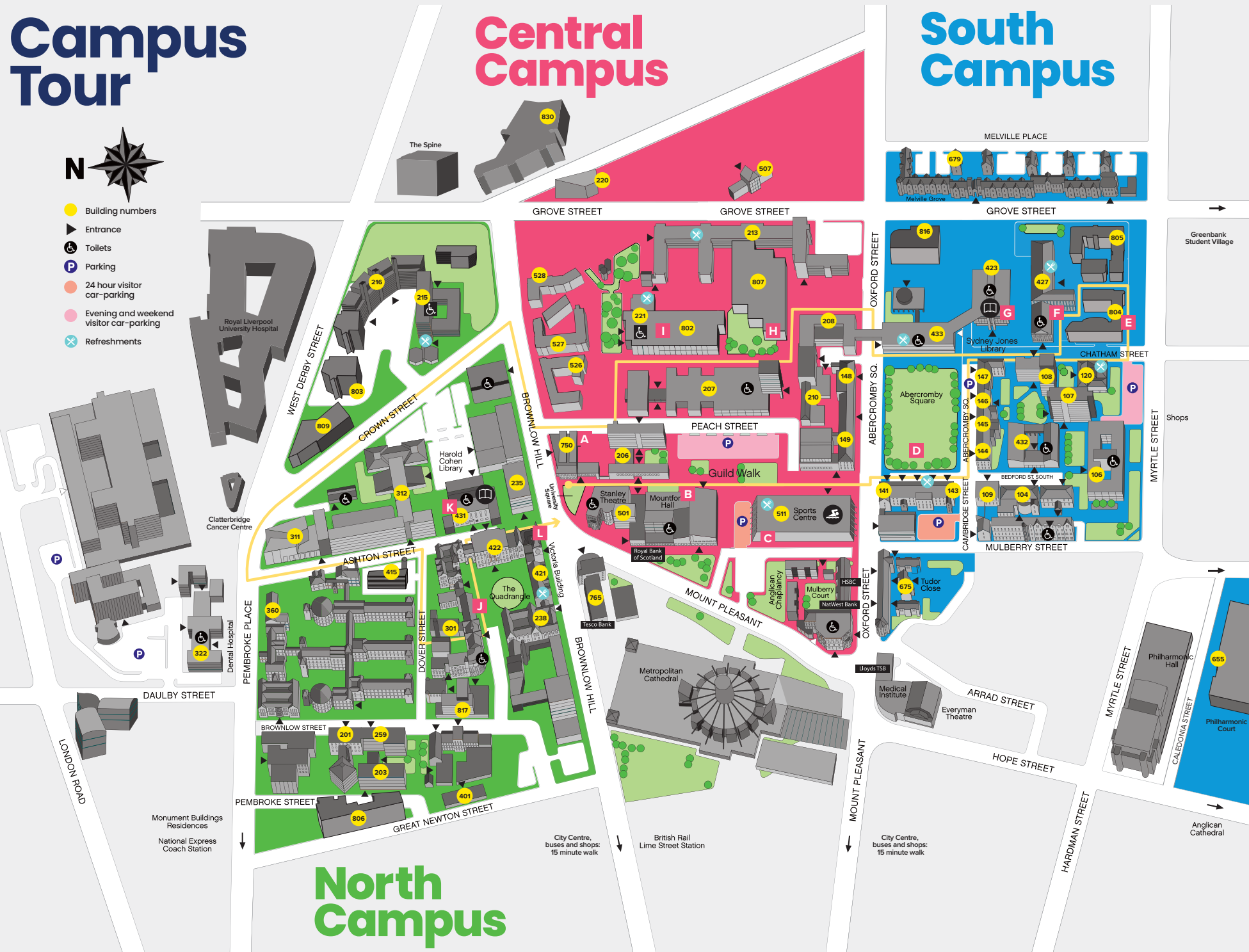
Sports Centre 511 | C

Harold Cohen Library 431 | K
 The Harold Cohen Library houses the collections for Medicine & Health Sciences, Dentistry, Vet Science and Science & Engineering. It has eight PC Centres, self-service laptops, bookable study rooms, bookable tables with screens for collaborative work and zones for silent, quiet and group study. There is a Postgraduate Study Room and Accessible Study Spaces are also available, as well as a Leisure & Wellbeing reading area. The Harold Cohen Library is open 24/7 throughout the academic year.

Management School 427 | F
 Our Management School is in the top 5% of business schools worldwide. The School's new extension is providing a world-class teaching environment, including the state-of-the-art Bloomberg Suite, for undergraduates, postgraduates and management professionals at all stages of their careers and alumni.



Central Teaching Laboratories (CTL) 802 | I
 The CTL has transformed the way in which Physical and Environmental Sciences are taught at the University. The building contains high-tech teaching facilities including laboratories and social study spaces.



Sydney Jones Library 423 | G
 The Sydney Jones Library is the main Library for the Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences, Environmental Studies and Law. It offers PCs, self-service laptops, bookable study rooms, bookable tables with screens for collaborative work and zones for silent, quiet and group study. There is a Reading Room for postgraduate researchers, a Leisure & Wellbeing reading area and several accessible study areas are also available, as well as a library Garden. The Sydney Jones also house the University Special Collections & Archives. This Library is open 24/7 throughout the academic year.



Materials Innovation Factory 807 | H
 The Materials Innovation Factory (MIF) is a £88 million partnership between the University of Liverpool, Unilever and HEFCE. Providing an unparalleled suite of open access, state-of-the-art equipment and world-leading academic expertise, the MIF is a unique materials chemistry research hub. The cutting-edge equipment here is helping us to discover new materials which have the potential to save energy and natural resources, improve health and transform a variety of manufacturing processes.



Engineering 238 | J
 Originally established in 1885 the University has invested a total of £36 million on the School of Engineering's flagship Harrison Hughes building. As part of this investment, the Active Learning Laboratory produces 'industry ready' engineers. The cubic glass structure spectacularly lights up at night.
